A Note from Our Resident and Family Services Director

A group of volunteers, named Carolyn's Angel Band, recently (and have in past years) performed at Westview Meadows at the annual remembrance ceremony. This is a group comprised of singers who perform their craft at the bedside of terminally ill patients. It is a very moving experience to hear them sing, and I wanted to bring more attention to the origins of the hospice singing movement in Vermont.

Music's healing and comforting properties are often utilized to provide powerful experiences to people who are experiencing end of life care, and, in the last twenty years, there have been several volunteer groups that have formed all over Vermont with the goal of fulfilling needs for comfort, solace and connection through singing. Hospice singing is a practice that involves singing for the terminally ill to comfort them and their families. In compassionate care through the end of life, treatments other than medicines can make a crucial difference. Bedside singing is a centuries-old tradition around the world, carried out by Benedictine monks in medieval Europe and Indigenous American tribe members alike. This practice in Vermont originated with a group called the Hallowell singers, who came together in the Brattleboro area and are affiliated with their local hospice agency. The singers typically visit a dying person in their home or hospital room to sing a number of songs, and are very sensitive in their approach and in their presence. They are accustomed to being as least intrusive as possible when entering and exiting a space. All of the singers receive specialized hospice training. Hospice singers' repertoire can range from spiritual to secular, and can include anything the person would like to hear. It's a special and peaceful experience, for the hospice patient and their family members, to share this sense of intimacy and comfort through the power of song. There are now several hospice choirs associated with hospice practices throughout the state, and the country. If you are interested in learning more, the founder of the Hallowell singers, Kathy Leo, who is responsible for teaching other fledgling hospice choirs around New England, has published a book called On the Breath of Song: The Practice of Bedside Singing for the Dying. Also, there is a documentary in which the Hallowell singers are featured called Holding our Own: Embracing the End of Life.
